Contest: Infographic

Rules and Guidelines

- 1. Entry must be the original work of the youth entering the contest. (Entries that are plagiarized will be disqualified.)
- 2. Entry must be family-friendly and age-appropriate.
- 3. Entry must contain the youth's name, address, e-mail address, age, date of birth, school, grade, parent/guardian name, and signed statement of authenticity.
- 4. Age category is determined by your age on December 31. Junior entries are for ages 9-13. Senior entries are for ages 14-18.
- 5. Two (2) junior entries and two (2) senior entries will be selected to advance to the State Written Communications Contest.

How to make an infographic

- 1. Pick a topic that you like and gather information (facts and data) from reliable sources. Add a reference section at the end of your infographic to list all of the sources that you used.
- 2. Plan your layout to include an introduction, main points, and conclusion. Add charts, graphs, icons, and pictures to show your data. Keep it simple and tidy.
- 3. Pick a few colors that coordinate and are easy tor read.
- 4. Text should be clear, short, concise sentences to explain your visuals.
- 5. Check your work to make sure everything is accurate.


There are many templates for making an infographic, like Canva and Piktochart.

Entries must be saved in PDF or JPG file.


